- 1 Hilroy exercise book - full page interlined ( 9 1/8 x 7 1/8) - 72 pages
- 2 Plastic two pocket portfolios
- 3 Duo Tang/ Report Covers (with prongs)
- 2 1" Binder D Ring (preferably with a clear pocket on the front)
- 1 12 pack of HB #2 Pencils
- 2 Dixon Primary #2 Pencils
- 4 White premium erasers
- 2 Crayola original thick washable markers (conical tip) - 10 pack
- 2 Crayola original fine line washable markers - 12 pack
- 1 24 pack Crayola wax crayons
- 2 4-packs of Expo low-odour or Crayola dry erase markers
- 1 Fiskars 5" blunt scissors
- 10 Elmer's Glue stick - 22 g
- 1 Elmer's School glue - 120 mL
- 1 Box of Tissue

- Outdoor Backpack
  - o We recommend Deuter Jr. Daypacks, \$59 from MEC (item 5031-512)
  - o *Please choose one with clips and drawstrings that can be easily opened or closed while children are wearing mittens/gloves*
- Fox40 Emergency whistle (on a clip attached to their backpack or jacket)
- Emergency Supplies (in a Ziploc bag in the Outdoor Backpack)
  - o Band-Aids and medical swabs (Q tip style)
  - o Emergency snack (granola or protein bar)
  - o Emergency space blanket
  - o Contact information (home and school contact - waterproof)
  - o Tissue (small packs)
  - o Chapstick
  - o Flashlight (small and light)
- Water Bottle
- Magnifying Glass

## Nature Kindergarten Outdoor Clothing List

- Base Layer - long johns and shirt (not cotton) preferably polypro or merino wool
- Mid Layer - fleece top and bottoms
- Outer Layer - waterproof pants and jacket (please make sure pants do not have a bib) Okiwear and MEC have good options
- Socks - wool if possible (not cotton)
- Gloves/Mittens - fleece mittens/gloves, multiple inexpensive ones
- Boots - waterproof hiking boots, or warm rubber boots like BOGS

## Helpful Tips

- LABEL OUTDOOR GEAR - THE KIDS ALL HAVE MATCHING STUFF!
- Avoid doing laundry every night by having extra items like rain pants
- Always pack a change of clothes (or send one to leave at school)
- Multiple pairs of extra gloves - the \$0.99 dollar store ones are great to have in backpacks for multiple changes on really wet days
