Kindergarten Registration & new student registration for 2018 - 2019

Registration for Kindergarten for the 2018 school year begins on Monday, Jan. 29 – Friday, February 2 at 8:00 AM. If your child was born in 2013 and will turn 5 by Dec. 31, 2018, your child is eligible for Kindergarten registration. Please read the information below if you're interested in the Nature K program at Saseenos. All registrations will be done on-line. We will also be registering new students at this time. If you are new to our area or are hoping to move into our area, please register your child/children.

Nature Kindergarten - 2018-2019

Nature Kindergarten program is offered at Saseenos and Sangster Elementary schools. This year was a pilot year at Saseenos and we are proud of the success of our program.

Students spend a half-day outside every morning, rain or shine, in natural settings. Children then return to school for their lunch and remain in the school during the rest of the afternoon for indoor learning.

Parents <u>must attend</u> one of the information sessions listed prior to registering their child into Nature Kindergarten:

Registration for Nature Kindergarten opens on Monday, January 29th beginning at 8 a.m.

Parents can register online or in-person at their neighbourhood school. If registering online, please select Nature Kindergarten as your preference. Parents who wish to register in person must do so at their catchment school and submit a request for Nature Kindergarten.

As this program typically fills up within the first day of registration, parents are encouraged to register for Nature Kindergarten as close as possible to the opening time of registration.

HEAD LICE AWARENESS

Head lice are common in BC communities. Although they are a bother, **head lice are not a health risk**.

Head lice spread quickly by close, head-to-head contact. Lice cannot live on furniture or carpet, and they cannot jump or fly. There may be few or no symptoms, but itching may occur. You can help by:

- Checking your child's head with the wet combing method of detection once a week throughout the year.
- Review the pamphlet Wet Combing How to Get Rid of Head Lice, available online, at your school and Public Health Unit.
- Encouraging your child to wear their hair tied back.
- Treating if you notice live lice on your child's head.
- Reminding family and friends about the importance of routine head checks.
