May – Strings participate in Greater Victoria Performing Arts Festival; Drumline marches in Victoria Day Parade; Beginner Strings inaugural performance at a Sooke Philharmonic concert

June – Drumline marches in Oak Bay Tea Party Parade; HPS Senior violinists perform at Sooke Youth Arts Fair and Sooke Philharmonic's Secret Garden Tour; HPS Year-end Concert by both Drumline and Strings, including solo performances!
